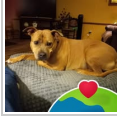
I want to also mention I never called him Clarence. His name was always Geezer. It was always my pet name for him.

He will be greatly missed by his neighbors and especially his special group of buddies here in Baxley. .there was a special bond between them all .

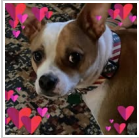
