Returning home after sixteen years he purchased The Baxley Abattoir and Meat Market where he ran it with his only son Ron and wife Laveen for twenty years before retiring. He and his family provided the meat staples for many of South Georgia's residents as a part of the flourishing livestock productions that are continuing to grow today. To this day people still ask his only son Ron if he will "make some of his daddy's sausage"! After retiring he and his wife traveled to the majority of the Continental United States, Canada and much of the Caribbean with their friends and family. Ronnie loved the "Big Trees" in The Redwood National Park, sightseeing in his motorhome and in his late seventies even enjoyed swimming with the dolphins in the Bahamas, bringing back tales a plenty from how the trees looked, the air was different and even how the dolphins felt. Ronnie was preceded in death by his wife, Laveen Rowell Lee, parents Quincy and Adel Kirkland Lee, brothers, Harold "Buddy" Lee, Daniel Lee, David "Piker" Lee, Frank Lee and Eugene Lee all of Alma as well as sisters, Eunity Sweat, Madeline Sweat and Mary Evelyn Hyers all of Alma.
